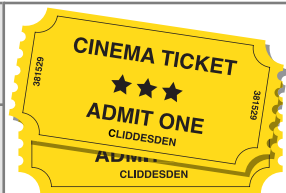

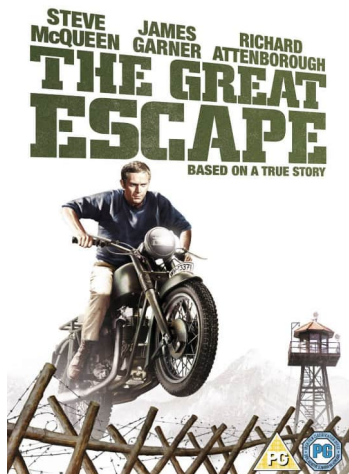

David Neylan: Some villagers will remember David Neylan, who has died aged 91.

He moved into the Three Horseshoes on Woods Lane in August 1983 with his wife Rosemary and sons Tony, John, Mark and Patrick, although none of the latter lived there permanently. He moved to a nursing home near Tunbridge Wells in 2022 to be nearer to his surviving family as dementia robbed him of the ability to maintain the house. During those years he lost his sons Mark (1984) and John (2008), as well as his wife Rosemary (also 2008).

He was a regular at the Jolly Farmer throughout all that time, going back to the days of Jim and Sheila, seeing off many landlords and landladies who were driven away by his questionable sense of humour.

His ashes will be interred in the churchyard alongside those of his wife and sons.
